Disability Health Network EAG Communique

The DHN EAG met for the second time this year on Wednesday 22 July 2020 via MSTeams. The decision to move to an online meeting was made due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The principal goal of the DHN EAG is to support the Network to guide improvement in health outcomes for people with disability across Western Australia.

Resignation

Presentations

- NDS Ready to Go Home Program overcoming delays in leaving hospital – NDIS ILC Mainstream Capacity Grant
 - Danielle Loizou-Lake Project Lead, Disability Health Projects, National Disability Services, was invited to present in conjuction with Dena Zarif.
 - Project launch information was shared.
- Dental Story Book
 - Martin Glick, Manager Central Clinical & Support Services, Dental Health Services NMHS presented on the benefits of using Social Stories to address anxiety and uncertainty for People with Disability when undergoing unfamiliar procedures.

State Disability Strategy – Department of Communities

 Work on the State Disability Strategy and Action Plan is progressing, with a further round of engagements with stakeholders underway over the coming months.

Sustainable Health Review (SHR)

- Jenny Campbell, as the Chief Allied Health Professions Officer, is providing the lead for Recommendation 15 – Improve the interface between health, aged care and disability services to enable care in the most appropriate setting and to ensure people do not fall through the gaps.
- Discussion regarding interface of health services with NDIS

Capacity Building

- Research
 - Partnering with organisations already mapping Health Services used in Primary Care setting, Hospitals, Dental and MH services
 - Tracking along 12 months of data
 - Running health literacy survey with front line support workers as well, to understand better how care is provided / decisions made/ health information works
 - Focus not broadly across all disability, but looking at the interface between disability service organisations and Health Services
- Making the Link Project (ACI NSW)
 - Feedback provided to the Making the Link Project team in NSW in regards to a draft "Essentials Toolkit" that was circulated for consideration as to whether it was useful for HSP's to better deliver health care to people with intellectual disabilities.
- Feedback was gathered and collated from 'Cognitive Impairment' project officers and 'Cognition / Dementia & Delirium champions' in the HSP's. Disability Health Reference Group
 - Co-Leads were invited to join the group giving the network an opportunity to be formally represented in the HSP arena in supporting inclusive health care
- My Health Record
 - Co-leads working with HSS (Frank Pattison) and the Australian Digital Health Agency in conjunction with Dr Rachel Skoss to investigate whether the MHR could be used to convey important information regarding people's disability to health workers (eg in Emergency departments)
- Employment of people with disability (Public sector commission target)
 - Funding available to support Public Service Agencies to adapt their practices.
- NDIS-Health Community of Practice
 - This sixth meeting of the NDIS-Health Community of Practice was held on 30 June with over 50 attendees at 44 sites in WA. The meeting confirmed a continued interest and engagement from health clinicians in education around the NDIS.

NDIS in WA update – Department of Communities

- Individuals receiving State funded specialist disability services in Western Australia (WA) are continuing to transition to the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS).
- As announced by the Minister for Disability Services on 21 May 2020, WA is delaying the transition of the quality and safeguarding functions to the NDIS Quality and Safeguards Commission from 1 July 2020 until 1 December 2020. This is a delay to assist providers manage the COVID-19 response. See

Communities has developed a new policy on the Authorisation of Restrictive Practices in Funded Disability Services. The policy applies to the use of restrictive practices in disability services funded either through the NDIS or by the State Government and also comes into effect on 1 December 2020.
