Urgent mental health telephone support for children and families

What do we do?

The urgent mental health telephone support line provides support for children and young people under the age of 18 years and their families. This includes brief assessment of mental health risk and signposting to the most appropriate service depending on need.

When can I call?

You, a family member, friend, support person or care-provider can call us 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, including public holidays.

If requested to leave a message please provide your contact details and your call will be returned.

What can I expect to happen if I call the 1800 urgent mental health telephone line?

The clinician who answers the telephone will ask you a series of questions to assess how they can best help. All clinicians are bound by strict regulations regarding confidentiality.

You will be asked about:

- Yourself, your family and where you live.
- Your current location and details of why you have called (i.e. what you need help with).
- Your mental health history, if you have any existing support services in place and, most importantly your safety.
- How urgently you feel you need help and why.

They will then be able to:

- Explore and explain what options are available to you and your family.
- Help you develop an action plan
- Work with you, your parent, guardian or other referrer to develop recommendations for your action plan and how to carry these out.

Assessments in Emergency Departments

Emergency Departments assess children and young people with a suspected mental health problem (PMH sees patients up to the age of 16).
